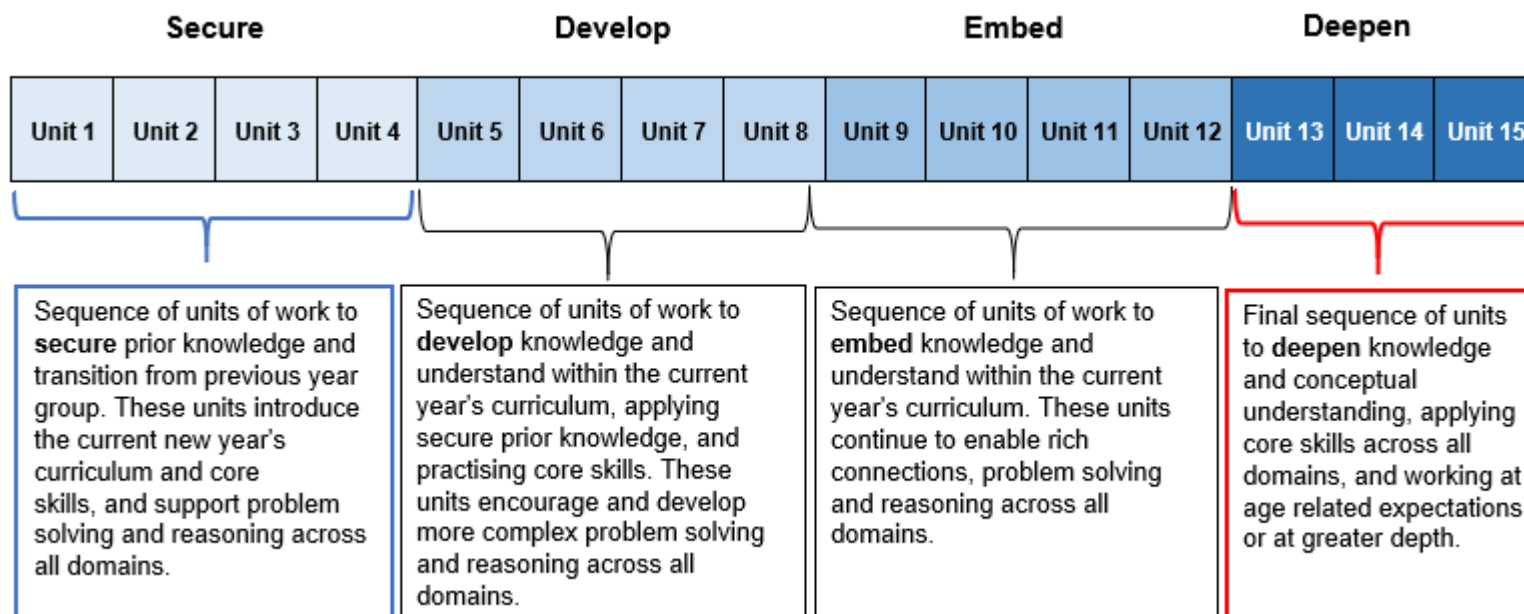

YEAR 2 Autumn Term

Measurement: Find everyday opportunities to develop children’s understanding of telling the time (quarter past and to the hour) and language (days of the week and months of the year).
