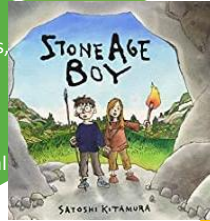
Geography

Where have we come from?

Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?

As Historians, let us travel back millions of years to the ancient, feral landscapes of the Stone Age. Hunt with your tribe through the untamed woods and try to avoid the deadly beasts that stalk the land. Discover what life was like as a nomadic tribe, following the food sources, feasting on your prize catches, painting your heroic stories of hunts on cave walls and surviving the harshest of conditions. Continue on to uncover how early farming was developed as you encounter packs of wolves trying to steal your livestock and begin to learn how to make tools and weapons from materials around you. Now walk through the mouth of the cave to Stone Age Britain - who knows what you will find there...?

Science

As Scientists we will be exploring the different types of rocks and how they are formed.

Computing

As Computing Technicians we will be continuing our learning on E-Safety, while focussing on coding and instructions.

Safeguarding

We will build on our knowledge about Online Safety and using Powerful Passwords

We will have an E-safety Day/ Internet Safety week.

We will be reminded about Stranger Danger both in person and online.

Art & DT

As Artists we will be researching Stone Age cave drawings and looking at shape, line skills and tone. We will be using our modelling and sculpting skills to create Stone Age tools and shelters.

As Musicians we will create our own drumming patterns and begin to use rhythmic musical notation for lengths of notes and rests.

RE

As Theologists we will be looking at 'Good versus Evil'. We will also be looking at the Hindu festival of Holi.

PE

As Athletes we will be learning creative PE & evaluating dance routines using pair work & group work. We will also be starting learning how to play the invasion game Netball.

We will be continuing to look at health and wellbeing before moving on to looking at safety and the changing body

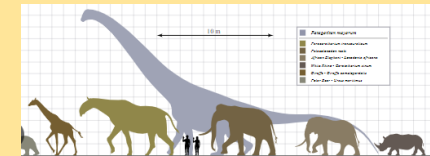
Computing
