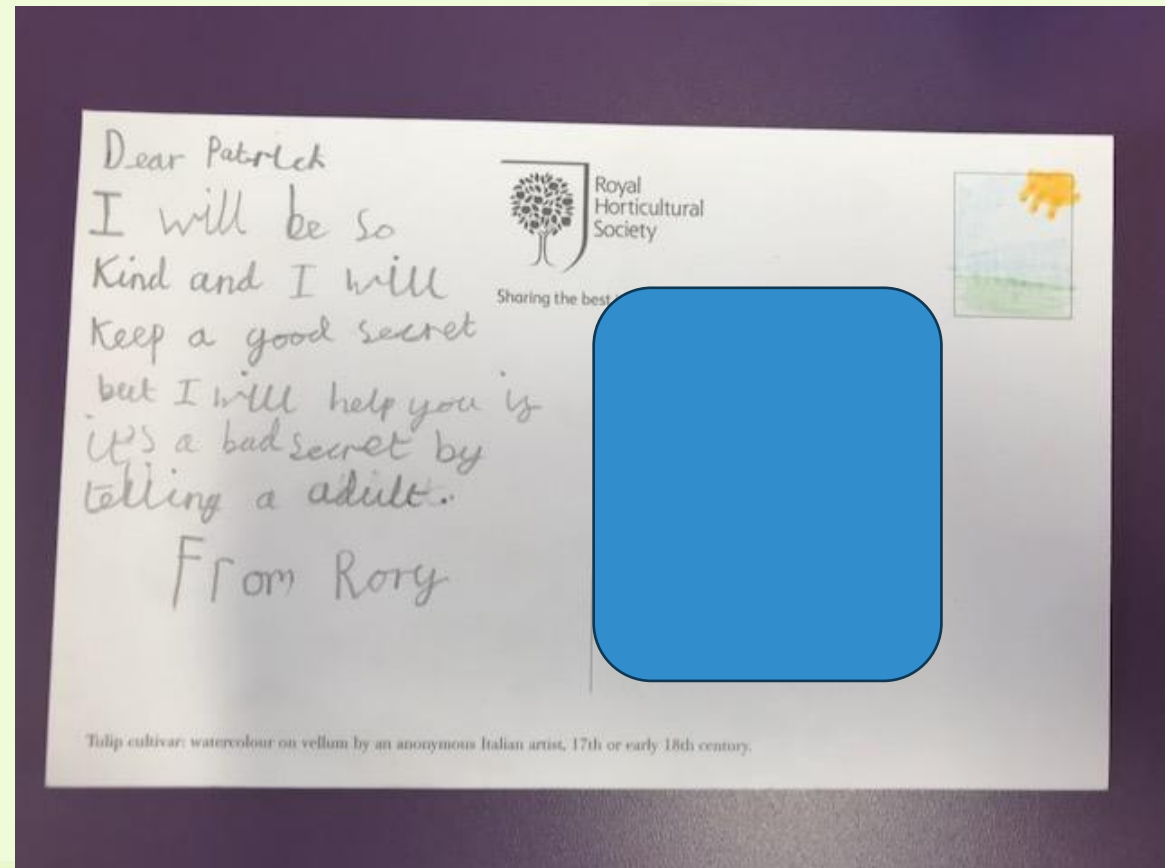
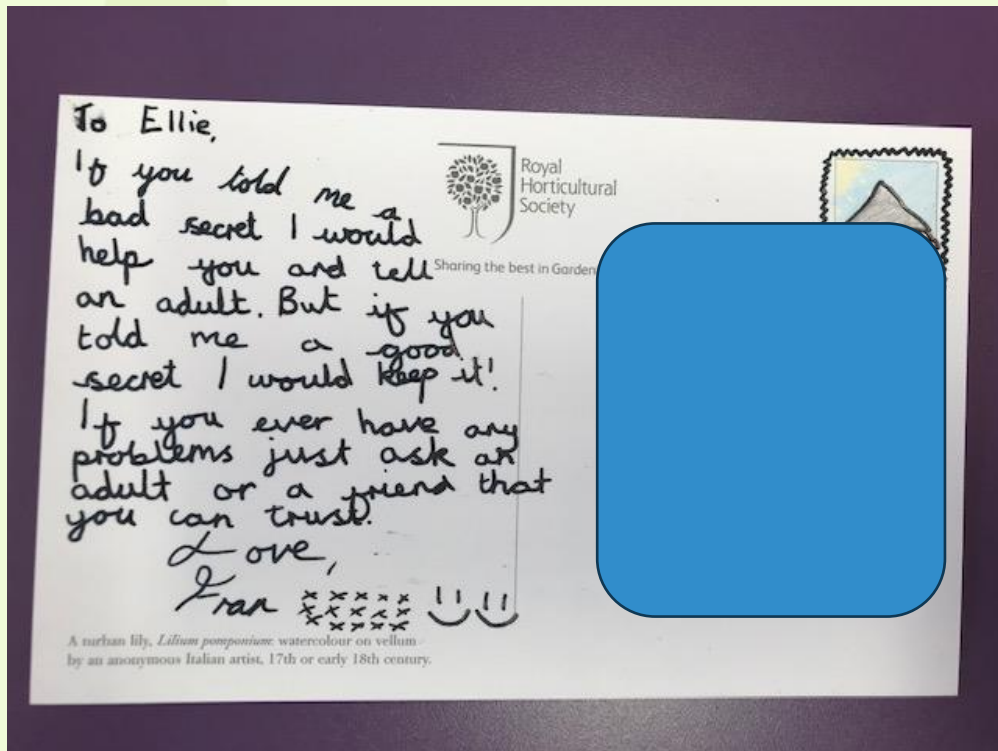


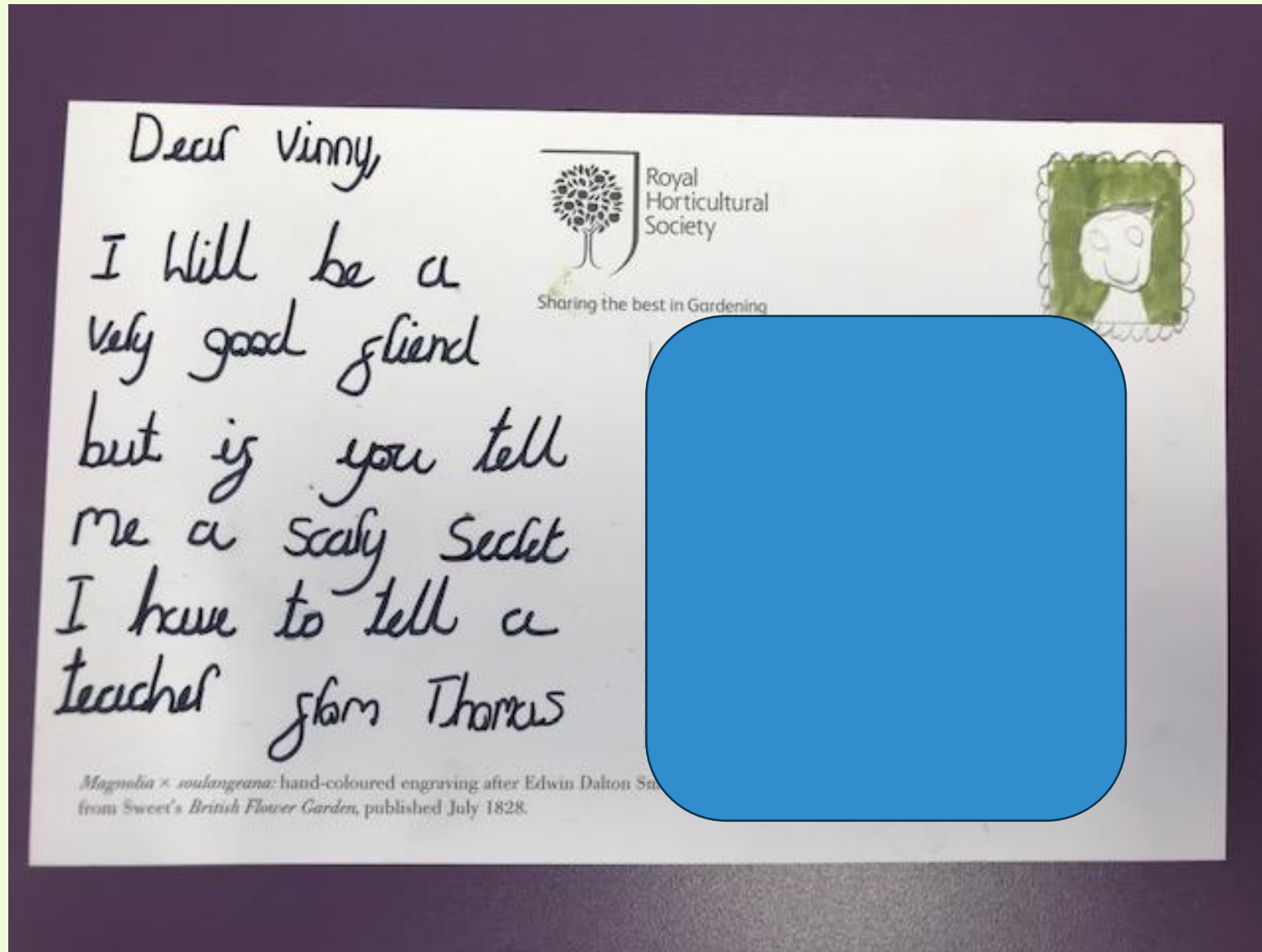
## Remember:
