



## St Alban's CE Aided Primary School

### PE and Sport Premium Report and Plan Autumn 2018

St Alban's Primary School uses the PE and Sport premium to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport which includes encouraging the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

### 2017 to 2018 academic year report

Funding allocated 2017 to 2018                      £17,900

Expenditure 2017 to 2018                      £17,980

During 2017 to 2018 the school invested the premium allocation to promote PE and sport and healthy, active lifestyles in the following ways:

- Half a day a week for an experienced PE Teacher to work alongside staff (including an NQT) to strengthen PE teaching through team-teaching and supporting planning and additional days for PE development and management during the year, including taking teams to competitive events. (£6,708)
- Continued funding of Active8 provision at lunchtimes to further increase activity levels for a greater numbers of pupils. (£2,625)
- Continued funding of two additional members of staff at lunchtime ('Play Leader') to promote active play, co-operation and fitness. (£4, 434)
- MIDAS Minibus training for PE Manager and TA to enable them to transport teams to local competitive events. (£547: Cost of training and cover for staff)
- Improving and increasing sporting equipment to support quality of teaching and learning (with a focus on gymnastics) and to increase participation in physical activity at break and lunchtimes. (£2,265)
- Additional equipment and fitting improved floor matting outside for the EYFS to promote physical development throughout the school day. (£1151 equipment and fitting costs)
- Encouraging healthy lifestyles through the provision of a free water bottle to every child for use during the school day. (£250)

#### Impact 2017 to 2018

- More pupils during the school day have increased their levels of physical activity in non-competitive sport and activities through the work of Active8, pupil Sports Ambassadors and the role of lunchtime members of staff (with increased equipment available at break and lunchtimes). Lunchtimes and playtimes are now more productive and active times for the majority of pupils. Feedback from pupils has been very positive.
- In addition, a range of other fitness related activities have been organised throughout the year which has not only raised levels of physical activity for all children, but has raised the profile of fitness and sport across the school. For example:
  - Sport relief - walking from St Alban's School to St Alban's in Hertfordshire (playground circuits completed by pupils totalling 370km);
  - NSPCC Big Buddy Challenge sponsored circuits for the whole school - children raised £843 for charity;



- Tennis, hockey and cricket taster lessons;
- Kelly Simm visit and demonstration (Olympic gymnast) and whole school sponsored circuits;
- Inter-house football cup June 2018 - all children involved across the school.
- Children regularly receive high quality coaching through team-taught PE lessons (the outcomes of which are evidenced in the success of our sports teams in competitive events). Subject knowledge for teaching staff has increased further through team teaching and this will be applied to future lessons that they teach independently.
- Considering the school is a small one-form entry primary school, our teams experience success in competitive events. As a result the profile of Sport across the school is very high. For example:
  - Year 5 and Year 6 Hockey League champions for the second year running.
  - Year 6 Hockey team qualified for the Hampshire Games Finals in Aldershot at the end of June 2018 - the third year in a row (coming 12<sup>th</sup> in the County).
  - Two Year 6 teams competed in the Havant Netball league, both competing well and finishing 5<sup>th</sup> in the league.
- The pupil Sport Ambassador role has been created and maintained with on-going training provided by the PE Manager and KS2 Leader for pupils taking this role each year. Children demonstrate high levels of commitment and skill in helping organise games and PE equipment for use at lunch and break times.
- Key staff are MIDAS trained and available to transport teams by minibus to competitive and friendly events.
- For the second year in a row St Alban's has been awarded the Silver Award in the School Games Mark.

### Swimming

For the 2017 to 2018 academic year, there is a new condition requiring schools to publish how many pupils within their Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

For the 2017 - 2018 cohort, 79% pupils (27/34) are meeting this national curriculum requirement.

### How the improvements will be sustainable in the future

- School leaders and Governors remain committed to the long term funding of PE and Sport development in order to maintain and increase the quality of provision already established.
- The pupil Sport Ambassador role has been created and will be maintained with on-going training provided by the PE Manager and KS2 leader for pupils taking this role each year.
- Subject knowledge for teaching staff continues to increase further through team teaching provided and this knowledge will be applied to future lessons. Continued coaching and peer mentoring for staff, particularly teachers early in their career, will ensure high quality teaching and learning.
- Training provided will have an impact over several years and will be refreshed periodically to ensure staff skills remain high.



## Sport Premium Funding Plan

### 2018 to 2019 academic year

The following information details how the funding should be spent by schools in 2017 to 2018. Funding and conditions for 2018 to 2019 have not been announced. Therefore the school is provisionally planning activities and spending based on the 2017 to 2018 conditions and funding levels. The plan will be revised when further information is received.
